I. <u>GENERAL INFORMATION</u>

A. <u>Overview of Services Requested and the Submission Process</u>

The New York City Police Museum is replacing its existing cooling tower with a unit.

The New York City Police Museum is seeking a full service mechanical contractor to perform contracting services for the replacement of the existing 70-ton cooling tower.

Proposals must be received no later than 5:00 PM EST, March 9, 2007. Work will be scheduled to begin on April 23, 2007 and be completed by June 1, 2007. In order to expedite the RFP process the GENERAL ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS and the OUTLINE SCOPE OF WORK is made part of this document. The detailed construction PLANS AND AGREEMENT will be made available at The New York City Police Museum office on February 26, 2007. An inspection of the premises may be made at anytime convenient to the contractor by making an appointment with The New York City Police Museum.

II. ANTICIPATED SCOPE OF SERVICES

The New York City Police Museum is seeking one or more firms to supply general contracting services to assist in its cooling tower replacement project. The New York City Police Museum requests proposals for firms to provide scope of work services as generally described below.

A. <u>Scope of Project</u>

The scope of work upon which your firm is invited to submit proposals includes full mechanical construction contracting services.

Demolish and remove existing 70-ton cooling tower and related equipment and furnish and install a new 90-ton cooling tower with all components necessary for a complete installation. New cooling tower shall be delivered in sections sized to fit through existing doorways, stairs etc. and reassembled on site in its final location. All associated pumps, piping, ductwork, electrical, controls, structural steel etc. shall be relocated or modified as necessary.

Your firm will also be responsible for completing surveys and monthly project summary reports as per the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation's (LMDC's) requirements. Sample forms will be available for pickup from the front desk of the Museum on February 26th.

III. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Proposals should provide a straightforward, complete and concise description of the firm's capabilities to satisfy the requirements of the RFP. The interested candidates must submit their responses by mail only in sealed envelopes clearly marked on the outside with the words "contractor qualification".

IV. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Please letter your responses exactly as the questions are presented herein. Interested firms are invited to submit proposals that contain the following information:

- A. Experience, Structure, and Personnel
 - 1. A history of the firm's experience providing Mechanical Contracting Services.

- 2. Samples of up to four (4) projects that the firm has completed in the areas of Mechanical Contracting Services. Include the client, the name of a contact person who is able to provide a reference, a description of the nature of the work, the size and complexity of the project, and the amount and the agreed fee arrangements.
- 4. Any other information that you believe would make the firm's work on behalf of The New York City Police Museum superior to that of other firms or information about your firm's specialty or particular skill to perform a specific requested service.
- B. Fixed Price
 - 1. Total estimated contract price for completion of the project.

V. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

In evaluating proposals submitted pursuant to this request, The New York City Police Museum places high value on the following factors, not necessarily in order of importance:

- Quality of work product as demonstrated in submitted work samples.
- Experience of the firm with comparable projects.
- Projected cost of services.

VI. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance and Bonds that the Contractor is required to provide. All Contractors' insurance policies shall name the Owner and the Architect and the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation as additionally insured.

- Workers' Compensation: to limits required by New York State Law
- General Liability: \$2,000,000
- Personal injury: \$1,000,000
- Property damage: \$1,000,000

VII. CONTRACT TERMS AND REQUIREMENTS

The contents of the proposal prepared by the successful firms, with any amendments approved by The New York City Police Museum, will become a part of the contract that is signed as a result of this RFP Process.

The New York City Police Museum reserves the right to terminate any contract entered into as a result of this RFP at any time, provided that written notice has been given to the firm at least thirty (30) days prior to such proposed termination date.

VIII. MISCELLANEOUS CONDITIONS

A. <u>Obligation Only on Formal Contract</u>

The issuance of this RFP, the submission of a response by any firm, and the acceptance of such response by The New York City Police Museum do not

obligate The New York City Police Museum in any manner. Legal obligations will only arise on the execution of a formal contract by The New York City Police Museum and the firm(s) selected by The New York City Police Museum. The New York City Police Museum may exercise the foregoing rights at any time without notice and without liability to any proposing firm or any other party for their expenses incurred in the preparation of the responses hereto or otherwise.

C. <u>Nondiscrimination and Affirmative Action Policies</u>

It is the policy of the State of New York, LMDC and as such The New York City Police Museum to comply with all federal, state and local laws, policies, orders, rules and regulations which prohibit unlawful discrimination because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability or marital status, and to take affirmative action in working with contracting parties to ensure that Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprises ("M/WBEs"), Minority Group Members and women share in the economic opportunities generated by LMDC's participation in projects or initiatives, and/or the use of LMDC funds.
